ORDER ENTERING CONSENT JUDGMENT AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Court based upon the District of Columbia's (District) Joint Praecipe Requesting Rule 68-I Hearing to Approve and Enter Judgment by Consent, for entry of this Consent Judgment and Order, filed on April 27, 2021. The District of Columbia is represented by Counsel, but Defendant Taylor is proceeding *pro se*.

On June 4, 2021, the Court held a hearing where Plaintiff's Counsel and Defendant appeared. The Court heard sworn testimony from the Defendant and found that he understood and comprehended the agreement. The Parties agree to the relief set forth in this Consent Order, and the Court further finds that the entry of the Consent Order is in the public interest. This Consent Order fully resolves this matter. A breach of any terms of this Consent Order shall be considered an unlawful violation of this Consent Order. This Court retains jurisdiction to enforce or modify the terms of this Consent Order as necessary.

For the foregoing reasons, it is this 4th day of June 2021,

FURTHER ORDERED that judgment is entered against defendant in the amount of eighty-four thousand dollars (\$84,000.00), consisting of seventy-four thousand dollars (\$74,000.00) payable to the District of Columbia's Vulnerable Adult and Elderly Person

Exploitation Restitution Fund (see D.C. Code § 1-306.86d) for restitution to E.T.¹, and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) in civil penalties payable to the District; it is,

FURTHER ORDERED that defendant shall pay the judgment in installments of \$1,000 per month beginning on July 1, 2021 and on each first day of the month thereafter until the full settlement sum of \$84,000 has been paid; it is,

FURTHER ORDERED that defendant shall (1) make payments by money order or cashier's check payable to the "D.C. Treasurer"; (2) include case number "2020-CA-005185-B" on the money order or cashier's check; and (3) forward the money order or cashier's check to Valerie Deal, Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia, Public Interest Division, 400 Sixth Street, N.W., Suite 10100, Washington, D.C. 20001. Defendant, at his discretion, may accelerate his payments, and the entire amount may be paid in full at any time; it is,

FURTHER ORDERED that, in accordance with this Court's separate Order of Condemnation, all funds held in defendant's Wells Fargo account ending in 4365 shall be immediately released to the District of Columbia (payable to the D.C. Treasurer) and credited against the full amount of the judgment; it is,

FURTHER ORDERED that defendant shall be permanently enjoined from obtaining or attempting to obtain money or property from E.T., either directly or indirectly through any third parties, and shall not communicate with E.T. concerning any financial matters; it is,

FURTHER ORDERED that the Preliminary Injunction of March 12, 2021 issued by Judge Jose Lopez is hereby vacated; and it is,
